The Respect Phonenumber is a confidential, freephone information and advice line for anyone who is violent and/or abusive towards their partners as well as for professionals.

Who calls the Respect Phonenumber?

- Men and women who are violent/abusive towards their partners in heterosexual or same-sex relationships
- Frontline workers from the statutory and voluntary sectors working with domestic violence perpetrators
- Domestic violence victims wanting to find out what help is available for abusers.

Respect Phonenumber and frontline workers

- We can offer advice about working with clients who perpetrate domestic violence
- We can give you contact details about perpetrator programmes that have signed up to Respect's best practice guidelines
- We can explain how perpetrator programmes work, what's involved, what's best practice and how they are different from anger management courses.

Respect Phonenumber and domestic violence perpetrators

One phone call will not bring about lasting change in the perpetrators who ring. However, the Respect Phonenumber will be able to:

- Encourage and motivate them to get help and to stop their violence and abuse
- Help them understand how their behaviour affects their family
- Sign-post them to perpetrator programmes in their local area (where these exist).

The Respect Phonenumber does not provide counselling and we don't meet people face-to-face. Our focus is reducing risk and increasing safety.

Respect Phonenumber and domestic violence victims

The Respect Phonenumber welcomes calls from (ex) partners, friends and relatives who are concerned about a perpetrator. The safety of those at risk – usually women and children – is a priority. We will:

- Give contact details about local perpetrator programmes
- Explain how perpetrator programmes work, what's best practice and how they are different from anger management courses
- Encourage (ex) partners, friends and relatives to have realistic expectations about the likelihood of perpetrators changing their behaviour.
